SHORT REMINDER

It seems probable that some players do not know that the tournament is played for IMPs. Thus sometimes overtricks are not valid... Let's look what has happened at one of the tables where match-point orientated declarer has forgotten the rules of safety play.

South was the declarer of 4♥ contract after bidding, where West was rather active:

West started (natural leads) with ♠K. Declarer took the trick with the ace in the dummy and (quite correctly ☺) tried trumps, cashing the ace. He noted the fall of the 10! At the next trick he played a trump and when East put the nine, followed with the small one, trying to catch KJ at West and score the overtrick (ace of clubs in practice was surely at West hand from the bidding).

But West did not follow the suit, and some serious problems occurred. East has played a spade, declarer ruffed. Now a club was led, West ducked. King in dummy took the trick, and a trump again. East took the trump king, played a club to partner's ace and after one more spade, ruffed by declarer, East was left with the master trump. Down one... Not a good bridge, this time. When in trick three East followed with a heart, contract was ice cold if declarer plays the queen (on assumption that West has a club ace) - only two trumps and the club ace can be lost...

MATCH OF THE DAY

We have here quite a numerous group of players with the world top title. I will try to show in the bulletin each day one match where the world stars will compete. Today it was match of the second round GROMOV - ISRAEL OPEN. In open room the world pairs champions from Sanya - Ehud Friedlander - Inon Liran - played against top Russian pair Andrey Gromov - Alexander Dubinin.

Boards were rather flat... The major swing occurred at the board No 13 (both vulnerable, dealer East):

1♣ opening was natural, as well as 1♦ response. 3♦ showed diamond support and good, distributional hand. West has shown a good hand evaluation, avoiding no trump. 5♦ looks not worse than 3NT, and in fact, this choice worked well. Gromov led a spade. Cards were well placed for declarer - he cashed three rounds of spades, discarding the heart from dummy, now played ace, king of clubs and the club ruff. In this way he lost only a heart and a trump trick. At the replay, Khokhlov - Matushko played 3NT, from the wrong (East) hand, two down after a heart lead. 13 imps for Israel.

The play was tough, although sometimes rather too aggressive. Here is the typical example of the modern bridge, which is "the bidders game" (board 12, NS vulnerable, dealer West):

Pass after 2♦ usually warns about major suits - the most common case is weak hand with 4441 or 4450 distribution. Anyway, East boldly bid 3♥, and paid two down. 2 imps for Israel, as at closed room East-West played 2NT, three down.

When you are a World Champion, bridge gods are with you and even major bidding misunderstanding costs nothing:

Spade lead and ten easy tricks...

Where was the piece of luck? Friedlander bid 4♥ convinced that partner's double simply showed a heart suit... His 4♥ bid was the simple application of the Total Number of tricks law. In fact in their system, double of the transfer after weak 1NT opening shows balanced hand, at the strength of at least good strong 1NT opening. Liran explained it to him. They did not agreed if the 1NT 12-15 PC opening should be treated as weak or strong opening. But the bridge gods gave him not only 17 well placed HCP, but also excellent heart support and club honor... Also clubs behaved - they did not broke 3-1 with small singleton at North hand.

This was a flat board, as Khokhlov - Matushko also reached the heart game. The final score of the match was 17-0 for ISRAEL OPEN, 15.75-4.25 VP. After 6 rounds, both teams advanced to semifinals.

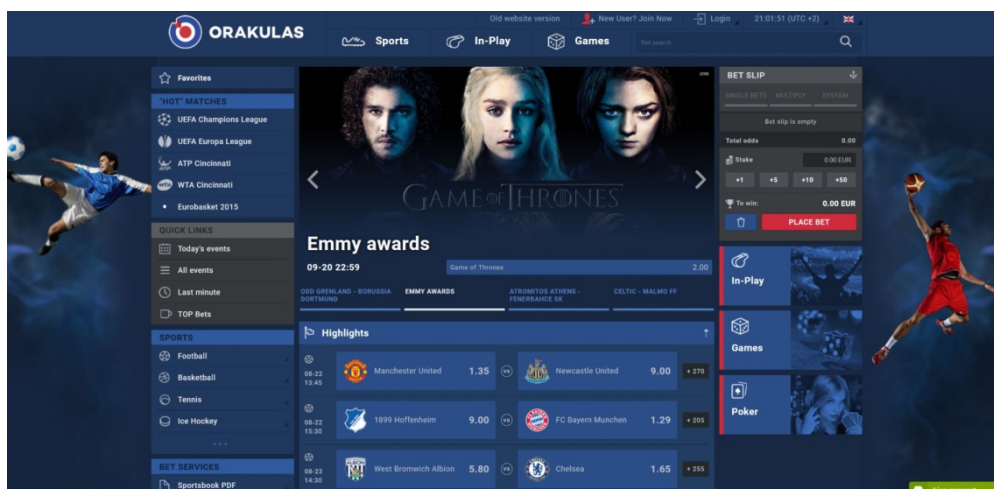
