GOOD, BAD (SLAM), AND THE BEAST

"It was a good slam... Depending on one from two finesses!" we could hear during first round of Thursday morning. The author is well known from his brilliant sense of humour, but this time he was speaking quite seriously. Let's look at the hands (rotated for convenience):

♠ AQ2	N W E S	♠ K63
♥ 3		♥ A1084

Would you like to be a declarer of 6♦ contract? Probably so... But the partner answered: "Good slam? Depending on one of two finesses? Both of them worked! But finally you were down two!" Here is the complete hand:

Board No 6. EW vulnerable, dealer East.

This slam, either good, or bad, was bid 13 unlucky times... One pair managed to bid even grand slam in diamonds! Lucky ones were the players playing Polish style short club where with the balanced hand with 4 cards in diamonds the correct opening is 1♣. Then diamond suit is usually lost and here they stopped in 3NT.

Put yourself in the shoes of the declarer of 3NT:

The bidding (from the match ZAWADA vs FLORA&FRIENDS) went (love all, dealer West):

North led the ♠K, and when it was ducked, continued with the queen, and South discarded a diamond. Declarer ducked again and spades were continued. This time South, with some problems, discarded a heart. The trick was taken with the ace and a club was played, North inserted the nine. Ace from dummy. What is your continuation?

Sztyrak started to be suspicious about the club distribution. First - fall of the nine was significant. If North had 109 in clubs, South would probably discard a club with 4 or 3 spots, not a club or heart. Second - rule of restricted choice made singleton nine much more probable than 109 sec. Second, South discards. Following this track, he played a club eight, finessing when South played a low one. It was the only road to 9 tricks. Look at the complete hand:

At the second table, North made the conventional overcall, showing at least 5-5 in majors, so declarers job was much more easier.

In the open room Miechowicz - Witek bid quite sensible 3NT, down two. Pair of world champions initially managed to stop at the partscore, but they have shown the points at the first opportunity:

East - West pair bid with no respect. Defence was also merciless. Tuszynski led his doubleton heart. Nowak cashed top hearts and played ♥2 to the ruff. Tuszynski returned a club. West cashed two club tricks and played one more heart, promoting one more trick for trump jack. 1000.

MATCH OF THE DAY

Trying to show you some good bridge, I was looking at the interesting table. Today at round three I have seen at one table Andrey Gromov - Alexander Dubinin facing Wojtek Gaweł and Rafał Jagniewski - professional pair from Bridge24.pl group, playing here at the PIEKAREK team. I could expect some good bridge, but like yeaterday, the board were rather flat, with no fireworks.

Once again there was only one double digit swing - at the board No 19 (EW vulnerable, dealer South):

Sequence was rather sophisticated. System worked well. It was not so easy as it looks like. During the bidding Sasha used many fingers to check all the steps, but finally he could count 13 tricks... Conclusion was correct and worth 13 imps for GROMOV team, as Piekarek - Gromoeller bogged down in 6♦.

Two non-vulnerable games, one missed by each team gave 7 imps for GROMOV and 6 imps for Piekarek.

At the following board good competitive auction of Gawel - Jagniewski resulted in overbid by Andrey (board 22, EW vulnerable, dealer East):

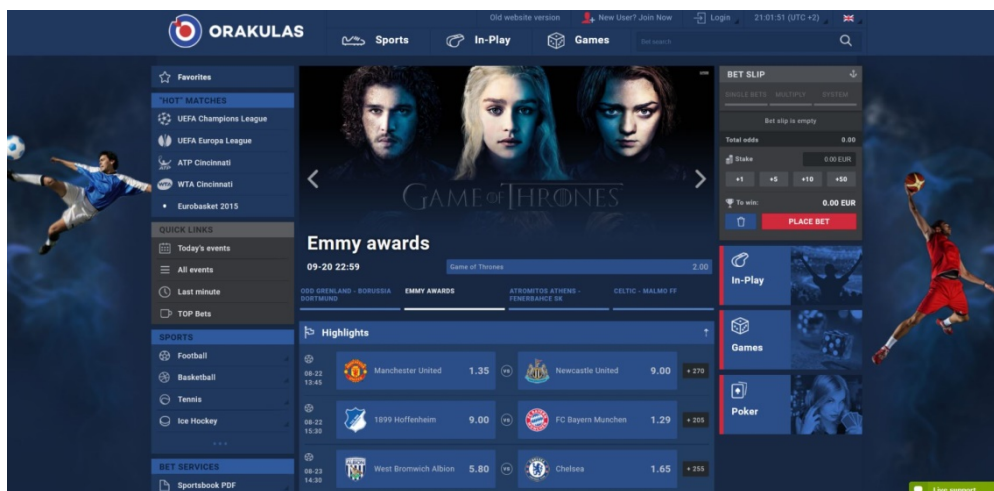
